

## SCHEDULE CHANGE PROCEDURES

- > Understand schedule changes will be made based on the level of urgency.
- > Errors will be addressed in the following priority order:
  - 1. Missing a Core class
  - 2. Placed in a class that was already completed.
  - 3. Placed in the wrong class level.
- > Requests to switch sections/periods or teachers of the same subject will not be granted.
  - \*\*\* In some cases, schedule changes may not be feasible due to conflicts with other courses, class size, or other circumstances.
- Counselors will contact you once they have confirmed that a priority error needs to be corrected.







## **Wireless Communication Devices**

In accordance with House Bill 1105 (HB 1105), the District is establishing updated procedures regarding Wireless Communication Devices (WCDs) for the 2025–2026 school year.

WCDs include personal smartphones, smartwatches, and messaging devices. Instructional Mobile Devices (District-issued or BYOD-approved) are not restricted when used appropriately.



## Wireless Communication Devices

#### **Grades 9–12 – Controlled Use**

- Permitted during the school day, but not during instructional time unless explicitly directed by a teacher for educational purposes.
- Corrective Actions: Using or displaying a personal wireless communication device without an approved exception is classified as a Level I Behavior, and only Level I Corrective Strategies may be applied.






